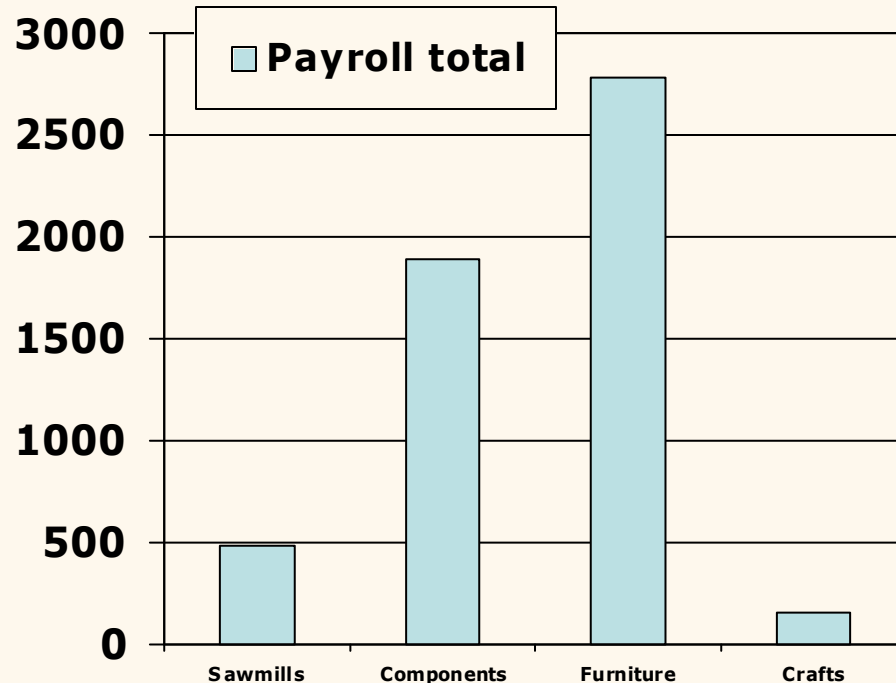
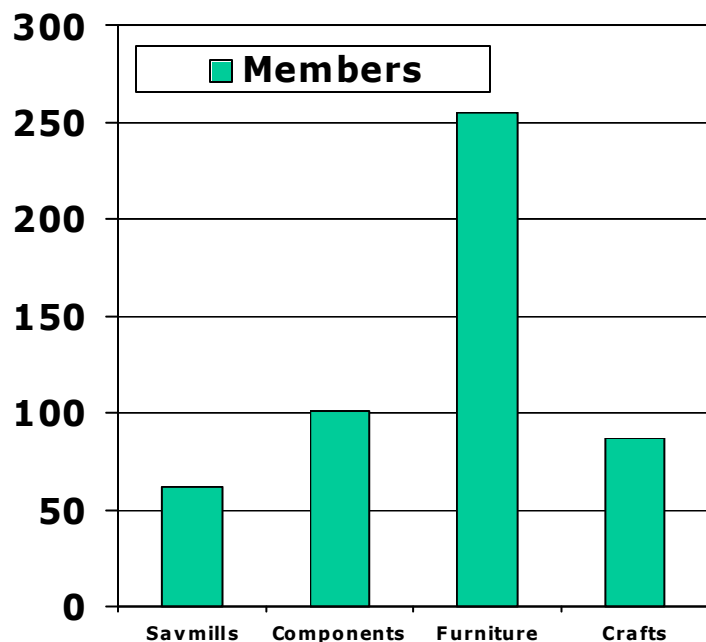
# The Association of Danish Woodworking Industries

- approx. 27.000 employees

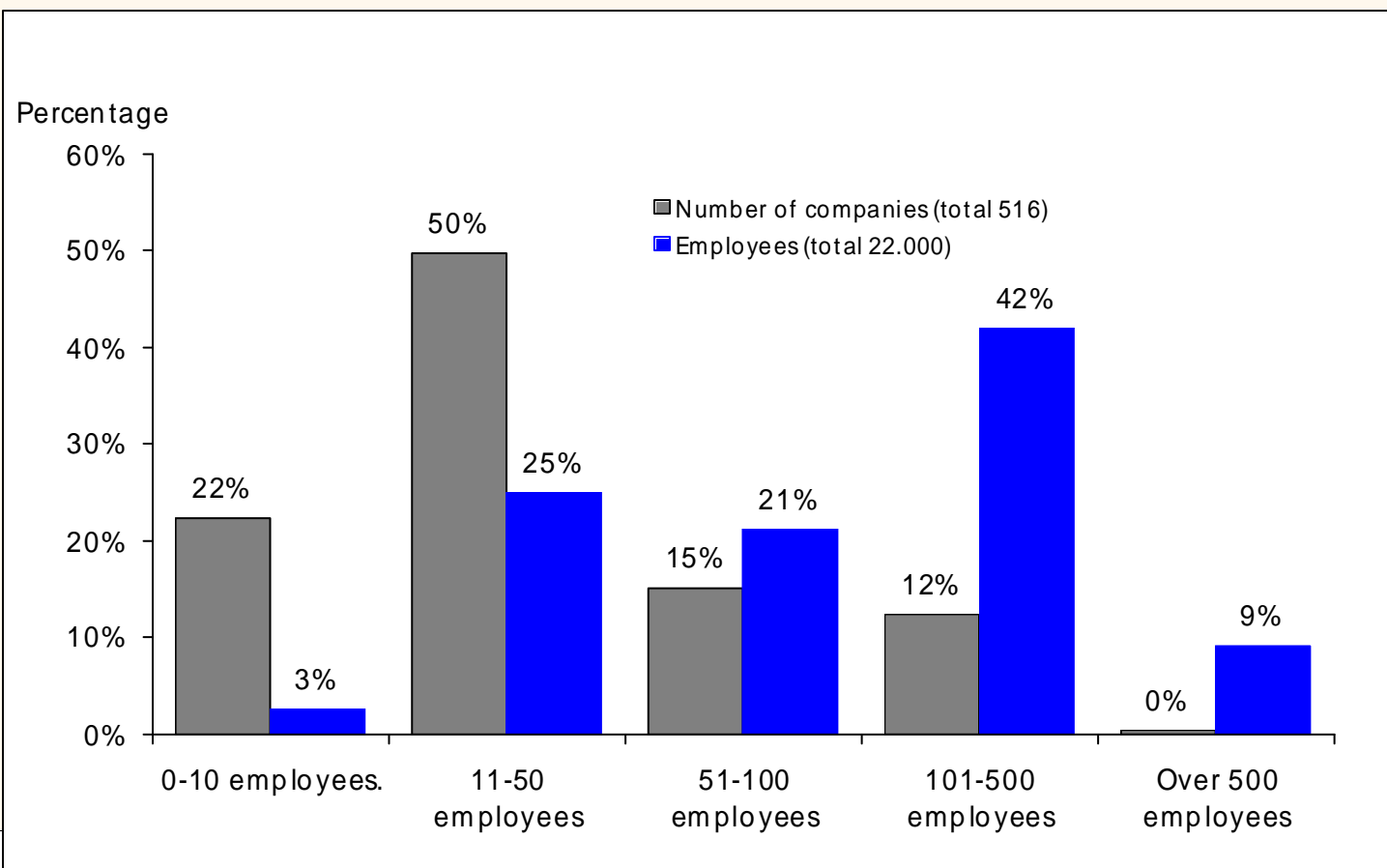
## **The companies represent the following produkt groups:**

# Confederation of Danish Industries



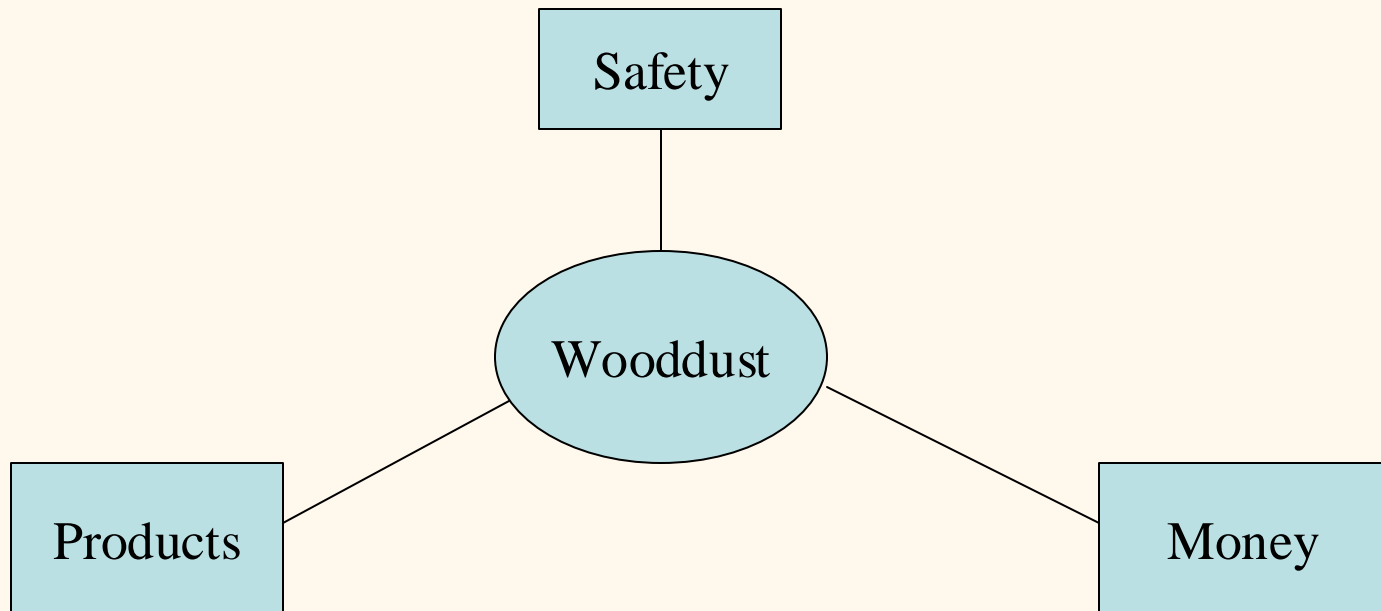
DI is a private organisation funded entirely by currently 6,100 companies.
